- Include increasingly ambitious vocabulary choices in their writing
- Communicate their ideas in an organised, coherent manner
- Spell accurately through a sound understanding of the morphology (word structure), orthography (spelling structure) and etymology (origin/history) of words
- Write fluently, legibly, accurately and eventually, at speed, in a joined handwriting style
- Use the correct grammatical terminology when evaluating their writing, or the writing of others
- Use the process of editing and revising to improve their writing
