wearing lots of socks!

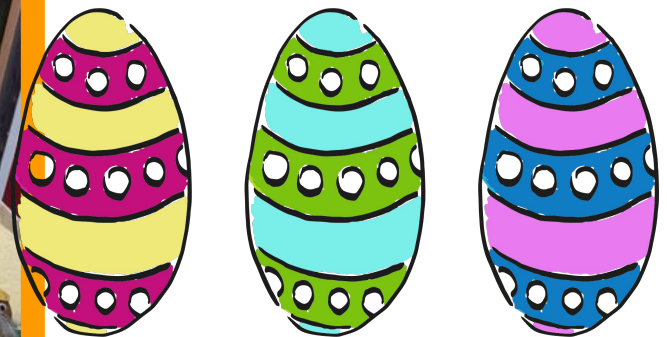
