You will be aware there has been a ballot by teachers' unions for strike action. Whilst no teacher wants to disrupt the education of our children, this action has become a way of highlighting to you the challenges that schools are facing. It is more than about teachers' pay. It is also because school budgets have been stretched so much that it is becoming increasingly difficult to provide the level of service we want to.

It is the NEU that have agreed to strike. The first date is February 1st. Although not all teachers are in this union, they remain supportive of their colleagues. I cannot share which classes will be affected at this stage but will keep you informed as soon as I can.
